The aim of InovHumRe is to improve the quality and effectiveness of Higher Education Institutes improving the education of Humanitarian Action students and professionals through the implementation of a curricular unit, in the second cycle of social science courses, for the evaluation in humanitarian action.

InovHumRe is a project financed by the Erasmus+ Programme- KA203- Strategic Partnerships for Higher Education and coordinated by [ISCTE-Insitituto Universitário de Lisboa](#) (Portugal).

Objectives and Target Groups

The main goals of InovHumRe are:

1. Improving the quality and relevance of teaching in the subject of participatory evaluation in European HEIs, specifically in refugee integration programs.
2. Innovating in HA teaching methodologies, develop new instruments and tools both at the pedagogical and substantive level, which can be replicated in different contexts.
3. Matching skills with needs of training at the professional level, thus contributing to improve the effectiveness of HA in the field.

The direct target groups are Higher Education Institutes, Students, Teachers, and NGOs. The indirect target groups are migrants, refugees, and other HA beneficiaries that will have the support from more qualified staff.

Innovation in Humanitarian Response

What will be the results?

- Comprehensive systematization of existing participatory evaluation approaches and needs applied to HA
- Contribution in an innovative manner to HA teaching through:
 - Adapted teaching/learning in the area of participatory evaluation
 - Adaptation to the digital transition which enhances the capacity for distance education
 - 19 HEI professors, 65 students, and 9 NGO staff fully capable of developing and implementing evaluation methods and systems in the HA field, as well as distance education
- Enhanced joint strategic work among HEIs as well as between them and NGOs
- Awareness raised and stakeholders across Europe reached through dissemination events



What will happen during the project?

Identification and collection of good practices in the area of participative evaluation in humanitarian action.

Development of three Multiplier Events in Portugal, Spain and Turkey for the dissemination of e-learning tools.

Throughout the project, four transnational project meetings will take place (online and face-to-face), through which partners will discuss the project situation point and will outline the next steps.

Final Conference in Portugal for the presentation of the Manual and sharing the results.

Short term training addressed to the partners to promote the exchange of ideas and sharing knowledge for the consolidation of the Syllabus (curricular unit).

Holding two intensive Study Programmes to be conducted during the pilot implementation phase of the Syllabus, addressed to students, teachers, and professionals working in the area of humanitarian action.

Delivery of a Handbook about the methodological evaluation of humanitarian action, condensing all of the learning, teaching methods, materials, and the description of the syllabus.
